Mycologia is printed by Allen Press for the Mycological Society of America (ISSN 0027-5514). *Mycologia* publishes papers on all aspects of the fungi, including lichens. Subjects appropriate to the journal are physiology and biochemistry, ecology, pathology, development and morphology, systematics, cell biology and ultrastructure, genetics, molecular biology, evolution, applied aspects, and new techniques. Publication in *Mycologia* is for both members and nonmembers of the Mycological Society of America. Papers appropriate for the journal are:

- 1) regular articles reporting original research,
- 2) notes or brief articles reporting research or new techniques,
- 3) invited papers,
- 4) reviews and mini reviews.

Inoculum is published on-line six times a year by the Mycological Society of America (MSA). *Inoculum* is available on the MSA website at <http://msafungi.org>. *Inoculum* focuses on matters of interest to the mycological community. It includes news of mycologists; information on awards and funding; job opportunities; internships and fellowships; symposia and meetings; brief articles on issues of concern to mycologists; and the business matters of the Society. Issues of the newsletter are being made available with the express permission of the Council of the MSA.

Recent issues of the newsletter are available on this server. Single issues may be browsed and the search option queries all of the issues posted on the server. Useful search terms might include personal names, names of institutions, project titles, or names of meetings. Use "and" to search for a two word phrase, e.g., search for SMITH AND AWARD to find guidelines or the deadline for the Smith Award. Searches are not case sensitive. Items returned from the search will correspond to sections in the newsletter. The search will return the first line of any section containing the search term. Select an item on the search results list to see the full text of the section.
